



Acknowledgement of paternity  This means: The man signs at the youth welfare office: I am the father of this child.	Acknowledgement of paternity is only necessary for unmarried parents. The father acknowledges paternity. The mother must give her consent.  If one of the parents is under the age of 18, a legal representative is required. For example: A mother is under 18 years old. Her parents can then agree to the paternity acknowledgement.  Acknowledgement of paternity at the Berlin youth welfare offices is free of charge. To acknowledge paternity at the registry office, you have to pay a fee. You must make an appointment by email. When your child is born, you need a lot of time for your child. But there are still some things you need to sort out after the birth.

For EU citizens: Apply for a birth certificate	This is how you get the birth certificate:  You register at a maternity hospital. Or at another birthing centre. The hospital will give you a leaflet: The leaflet contains all the necessary documents. For example: Your own birth certificate. You take the documents with you to the hospital.  The hospital writes your child's birth details on a form. The parents give the child a name. The parents sign the form.  You may be able to apply for the birth certificate at the hospital. The hospital will then pass on your details to the registry office. If your child was born in Spandau, then the registry office in Spandau is responsible.  The registry office will give you the birth certificate. You will have to pay a fee for this.  Do you need help with translating? Then translators can help you. The health insurance provider will send you a registration form. Use it to register your child with your health insurance provider. Your child will receive their own insurance card. This will take about 2 weeks. However, medical treatment is possible before then.	As soon as you have the birth certificate. 
